On Friday, July 5th, Wonder Lake will celebrate the 4th of July with a fireworks display. All Sunrise Ridge property owners & their guests are invited to join us at Beach Park to view the light show. Be sure to bring your 2002 SRA beach tag to gain entrance. Boy Scout Troop 456 will be selling glow-in-the-dark necklaces. So bring a few dollars to support their cause. **The boat launch will be closed between 6 p.m. & 10 p.m. Vehicles & trailers will not be allowed in the park during that time.** Join us again at Beach Park on Saturday, July 6th, at 9 p.m. for the Venetian Parade.

The SRA Picnic will be held on Saturday, July 27th, from Noon till 5 p.m. We're planning to have burgers, brats, hotdogs, roasted corn-on-the-cob, soda & beer for sale. Please bring a favorite dish to share & some lawn chairs. We will have games for the kids & raffles for everyone. We will also have a dunk tank & an inflatable for the kids named Mutiny on the Bouncer. The Wonder Lake Police Department will join us again this year. They are planning to conduct bicycle inspections & registration for those who are interested, as well as a bicycle rodeo to test your cycling skills. We need help with cooking, selling tickets, running games & cleanup. Call Mary Peters at 653-9871 to volunteer. **The boat launch ramp will be closed from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. for the picnic.**

The next regular meeting of the SRA Board of Directors will be on Wednesday, July 31st, at 7:30 p.m. in the Wonder Lake Village Hall on Thompson Road. Residents in good standing (no dues in arrears) are invited to attend. The ideas & involvement of more SRA residents is welcome.

Only one person responded to the last newsletter regarding the purchase of a pier for day parking of residents' boats. Due to the lack of support for this project, the funds have been redirected. Some of the money will be used to enhance/extend the existing pier & the remainder of the funds will be used to improve/repair the pavement at Beach Park. The area next to the pavilion, where vehicles pull up to the fence to back their trailers into the water, will be paved. The breaking edge of the drive & the holes developing in the drive will be repaired. **Sometime in July or August, the drive & boat launch will be closed for several weekdays for the work to be done. A notice will be posted at Beach Park one week in advance of the closure.**

The Annual Meeting of all SRA property owners will be held on the last Wednesday of October at 7 p.m. in the Wonder Lake Village Hall on Thompson Road. A notice containing the agenda will be mailed in early October. Elections will be held for President, Treasurer & Directors (District Reps) for the 4 even-numbered districts. We still need beach guards to fill some of our shifts through Labor Day. Guards must be at least 18 years old & do not need to be lifeguards. Duties include checking for beach tags & vehicle stickers and enforcing the rules. Daytime shifts are usually 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. & 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. Evening shifts are usually 6 p.m. to 9 p.m., Sunday through Thursday & 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. on Friday & Saturday. The pay is \$6 per hour (no taxes are withheld). If interested, contact SRA Clerk, John Carter, at 653-9073.

We are still having trouble with glass containers & dogs at Beach Park. Even if there is no beach guard to enforce the rules, the rules still apply. Broken glass is extremely dangerous in a park where many walk & run barefooted. And we don't need dogs in the park adding to the mess we already have to contend with from the ducks & the geese.
