The fall season is now upon us and the raking of leaves has begun. Mulching of leaves with a mower is the preferred method of disposal but if you have too many leaves this may not be a reasonable solution. The Village of Wonder Lake is buying two, trailer-mounted, leaf vacuuming systems. Keep your eyes & ears open for announcements of the dates when leaves should be raked to the side of the road for pickup. Please burn your leaves only as a last resort. If you feel you must burn, village ordinances allow the open burning of leaves & yard waste only on Friday & Saturday. All fires must be attended until extinguished & should be doused with water to prevent extended periods of smoldering. Do not burn leaves at the edge of the road as it may damage the pavement. A citation & \$100 penalty can be issued for each violation of the open burning ordinance.

The 3-foot draw down of the lake ended on October 2nd. Much debris, including many hazardous glass bottles, was removed from the exposed lake bottom at our Beach Park. Several items were also pulled from the shallow water around Creek Park. Two major projects were undertaken at Beach Park during the draw down. An erosion control sea wall made of boulders was constructed between the north end of the beach area & the existing steel sea wall at the north property line. Another project was the modification of the boat launch ramp area to fix the problems residents were having when launching their boats.

Although response to this year's Candlelight Bowling at the end of March was less than we had hoped, everyone who attended had a good time. We would like to have another Candlelight Bowl sometime in January, February or March of 2002. We are looking for beach guards for next summer. Guards must be at least 18 years old & do not need to be lifeguards. Duties include checking for beach tags & vehicle stickers and enforcing the rules. Shifts are usually 10am to 2pm, 2pm to 6pm & 6pm to sunset from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day.
